CALENDAR - SAINTS OF THE WEEK

29th **July – St Martha, Mary and Lazarus:** Martha received the Lord into her house and provided for his needs with great care. At her request, the Lord raised her brother from the dead.

30th **July – St Peter Chrysologus:** Bishop of Ravenna in the fifth century. Used short homilies as a way of instructing the faithful as

well as writing learned theological and dogmatic texts. He died in 450.

31st July – St Ignatius of Loyola: Former Soldier. Jesuit Founder. Pope Francis is the first member of the Society of Jesus to be elected Pope.

1st **Aug – St Alphonsus Liguori:** Bishop, Doctor of the Church and founder of the Redemptorist Congregation. Died in 1787.

THOUGHTS

Today and for the next few Sundays we abandon St Mark's Gospel and follow Chapter Six of St John's Gospel, the long and highly significant discourse that follows on from the feeding of the five thousand.

The twelve protest that they are unable to feed the multitude but in Jesus' hands the insignificant offering becomes enough to feed everyone, with twelve hampers of scraps leftover.

With the First Reading in mind, from the Second Book of Kings, it becomes obvious that this is not simply an account of a happening, however extraordinary. The writer of John's Gospel intends this to be a

piece of teaching. Jesus' mission is to the whole of Israel, the twelve tribes already symbolised by his choice of an inner circle of twelve disciples. The needs of the people are not fed from nothing. Some small token comes from among them but is transformed by Jesus to become a superabundant nourishment, but this is only the beginning, and the enthusiasm of the crowd is for immediate and material satisfaction.

This is the first of five weeks when we journey through the sixth chapter of the Gospel of St John. It comes as a surprise to many that in the Gospel of St John there is no account of the Last Supper, apart from Jesus washing his disciples' feet. The other three

Gospels describe Jesus taking bread and wine and commanding us to do this in memory of him and, as we know, the earliest written account that we have of the Last Supper was written by St Paul in his First Letter to the Corinthians describing the tradition already being handed on from a meal at which Paul himself was not present.

This is a wonderful opportunity for us over the next few weekends to deepen our understanding and appreciation of Jesus' farewell gift of love, the Blessed Eucharist in which we truly believe he is bodily present in the bread that becomes his Risen Body and the wine that becomes his Precious Blood.
